



## MARINE FLARE DISPOSAL

This Marina is no longer accepting **MARINE FLARES** for disposal. **Marine Flares** are accepted for disposal by the **Local Hazardous Waste Management Program** in King County at three Household Disposal Locations.

Marine Flares are accepted at the North Seattle Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility and King County Solid Waste Collection Sites at *South Seattle and Factoria*.

**Note: Consumers are limited to dropping 10 flares per visit, per day.**

### **North Seattle Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility**

**Hours:** Sunday - Tuesday, 9:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

**Closed on July 4, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day.**

No appointment needed. There is no fee for hazardous waste disposal. It is paid for in your utility bills.

For **Small Businesses** - Facilities will also accept up to 10 flares per visit; **however Small Businesses are limited** to one visit per month and four visits per year. Under limited circumstances **Small Businesses** may deposit more than 10 flares but pre-approval is needed. The **Business Waste Line** should be contacted at 206-263-8899.

Hazardous Materials Collection Sites have limited storage authorization under current fire permits. If a facility reaches capacity before arranging final disposal they will need to cease accepting flares temporarily until the approved storage containers are emptied. The Local Hazardous Waste Management Program strives to provide uninterrupted service.
